



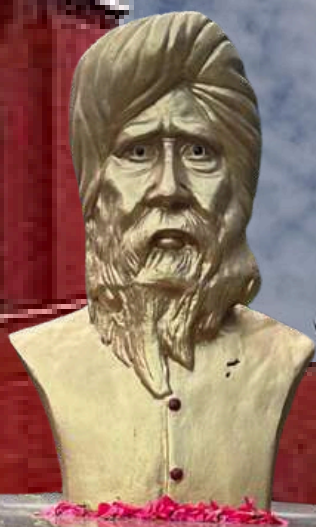



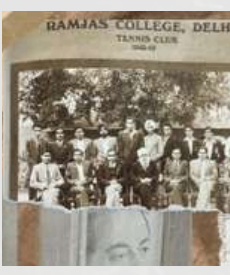

## INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE COLLEGE

Ramjas College prides itself on a vast, lush green campus, with canopied sidewalks, green and clean lawns having more than 76 species of trees, and solar panels with an eye to a sustainable future. The new academic building is among the tallest in the university, is well-ventilated and equipped with lifts for easy access.

The institution has a total of 96 classrooms across two buildings, most of them equipped with projectors. We have a robust research environment with 27 departmental laboratories and four air-conditioned and well-equipped computer labs, as well as the Dr. Harsh Malhotra Research Centre to promote research and innovation. The library is a double-storied, air-conditioned building with a diverse range of books. The institution is also equipped with a seminar hall, a fully air-conditioned conference hall with a capacity of 200, a fully air-conditioned auditorium that can accommodate over 450 people, and an enabling unit. The board/seminar room is equipped with smart boards and projectors, and a conference room for a dedicated learning and meeting environment, and a student activity centre/ECA room.

The college has separate hostels for boys (with a capacity of 130) and girls (with a capacity of 80). The college has one of the best sports facilities in the university. We have a Volleyball court, basketball court, football ground and a shooting range. The campus also includes a fully air-conditioned gymnasium with the latest equipment and a physiotherapy room, a girls' common room, medical room, photocopy shop and a staff room.

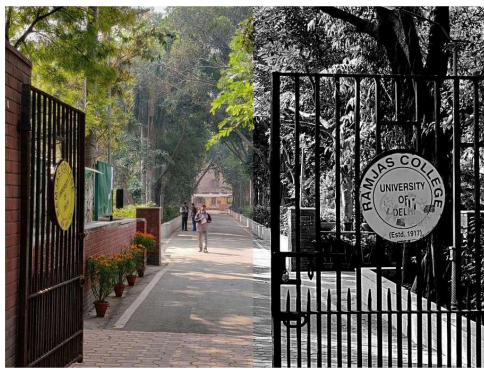

# DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The Department of Botany has been at the forefront of teaching and research in plant sciences. The Department admits students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Degree in Botany. In collaboration with the Departments of Zoology and Chemistry it imparts learning to students of B.Sc. (programme) in Life Sciences. The syllabi for all the courses taught by the Department are continually updated to include the latest developments in plant sciences. These syllabi cover all aspects of botany - ranging from diversity in structure, form, development and function to systematics, basic and applied aspects of cell and molecular biology, genetics, biotechnology, medicinal botany, ecology and environmental management. During the year the Department organizes study trips to various places of botanical interest and modern research laboratories. The Departmental society, Bloom for the students organizes seminars and co-curricular activities throughout the year. The annual departmental journal Vasudha is a platform for faculty and student to showcase their learning. 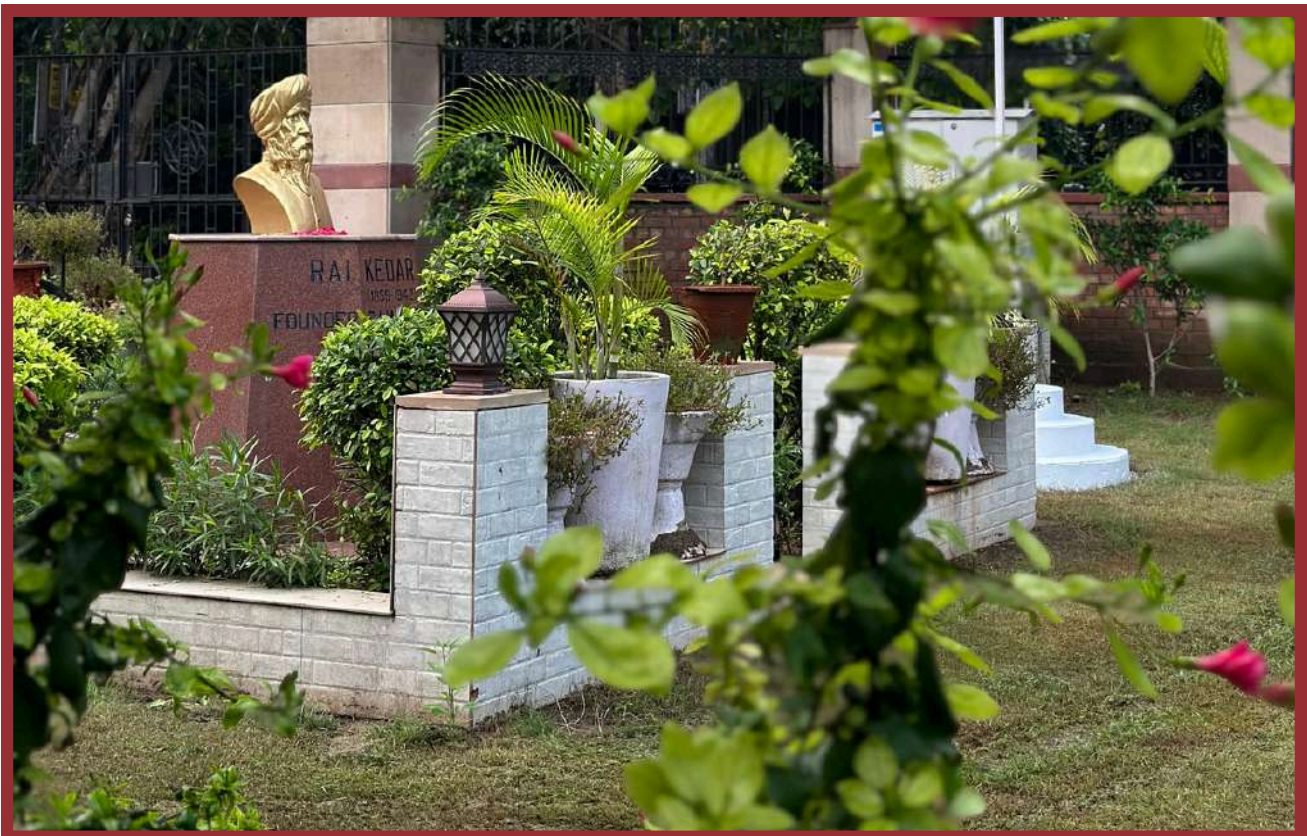

# STUDENT INFORMATION SERVICES (SIS)

The student information services (SIS) system is an important innovation introduced in the college to facilitate better management of information and data relating to academics and general administration. It is accessible through the college website [www.ramjas.du.ac.in](http://www.ramjas.du.ac.in). Whereas the website carries a host of information on the college, the login option for SIS is restricted to students, staff and the administration of the college. The system is web based and accessible at any location through the Internet. All academic and administrative data relating to students are uploaded, stored, processed and retrieved through the dedicated software that runs SIS. From tutorial management to term wise attendance, from midterm marks to assignment grades, from backend reports to all important information (like syllabus, important dates, etc.), SIS is primary driver for information management in Ramjas. 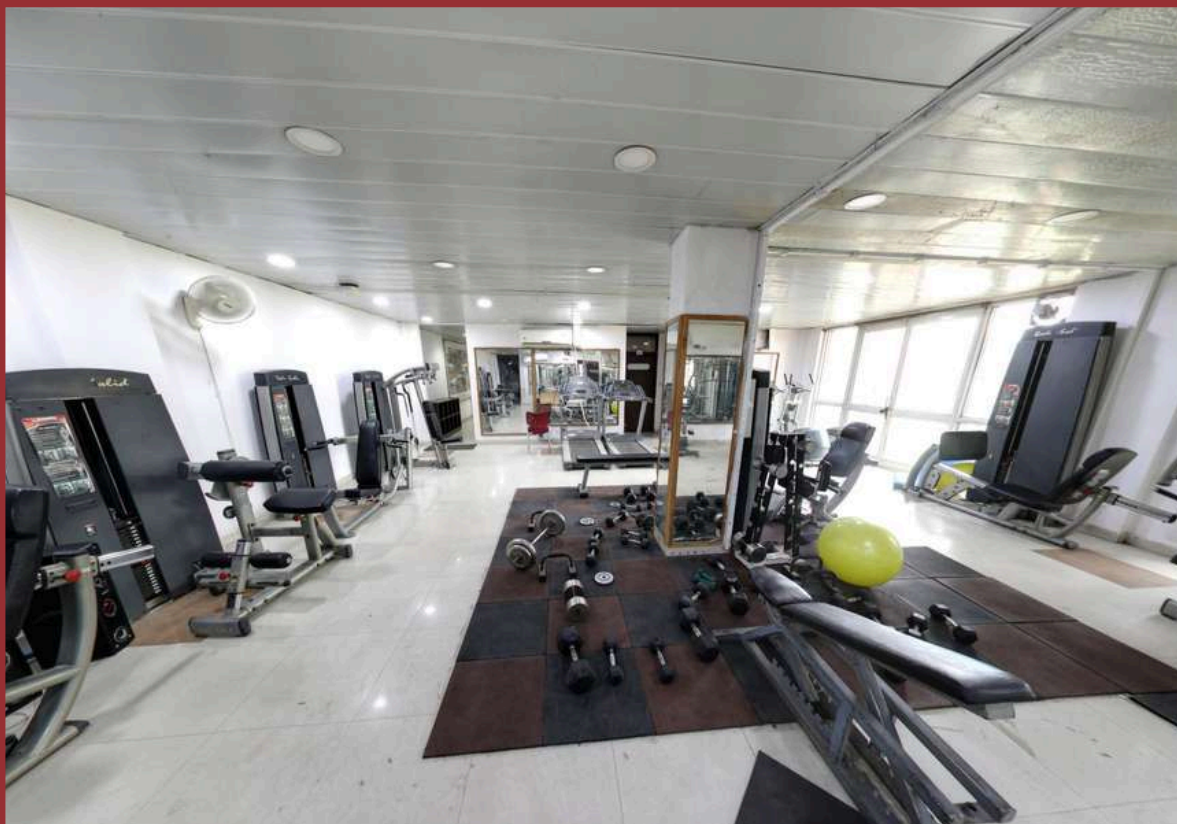


# SPORTS

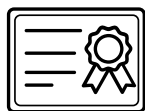

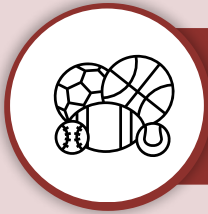


