12. Placement Details:

The year 2015-16 proved to be very fruitful for the placement cell. Around 250 students across all streams and subjects participated in the placement drives conducted by diverse corporate institutions. A total of 34 elite companies visited the campus offering job profiles

ranging from marketing to research, audit and content writing. Some high profile companies who visited were Wipro, KPMG, Deloitt, NIIT, Genpact and many other excellent start up companies. The average package offered was 4-5 lakhs per annum, with the highest being 11 lakhs per annum. The number of students selected for final placement during the year was around 100.

- 1. Centre for International Education (CIE), Ramjas College, University of Delhi, continues to be a star in the prestige of the College. The College has agreements for academic cooperation with 7 institutions viz., International Education of Students (IES), USA, the State University of New Jersey, USA, Denmark's International Study Program (DIS), Copenhagen, Faculty and Student Exchange Programme with the University of Antwerp, Belgium, Exchange Programme with Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS).
- A Memorandum of Understanding / Cooperation Agreement has also been signed with The Washington Center, Washington D.C., USA. The Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars offers opportunities to undergraduate students for internships in public agencies and international organizations from four weeks to four months. The Washington Center offers full scholarship to a few students during the January – May semester.
- 3. A Memorandum of Understanding has also been finalized with the School of Business and Social Sciences, Aarhus University, Denmark. This agreement covers exchange of students and faculty between the two institutions. Students can study regularly offered courses at the host institution for one or two semesters. Aarhus University will give travel grants to two students per semester from Ramjas. The faculty exchange covers opportunities for research and teaching at the host institution. The Agreement also envisages joint cultural programmes, participation in seminars and academic meetings, exchange of academic material and special short-term academic programmes including summer school.
